- We aim to constrain contact to the broader community and restrict activities as far as possible to the core practices of the school.

- alleviate associated risks and anxiety for our school community.

Catholic Education Tasmania is in constant contact with the Department of Health, Tasmania and the Director of Public Health and is taking all advice from them.







Project Compassion and Lent
