Dear parents and guardians,

As we move towards the middle of Term Two and the days get shorter and colder, please ensure that your children bring jumpers and coats, if needed, to school as we do like them to get outside and run around as often as they can. 



There will be a consent form for Rumble's Quest sent to families via Compass so that your child can participate in this program.

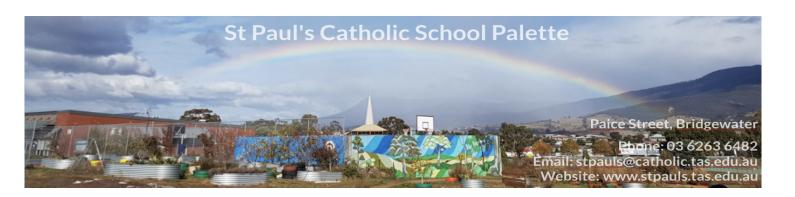

Attachment to School - how children feel about school
 Social Confidence - how children feel about themselves and how they relate to others
 Self Regulation - how children manage
 The challenges call on the following skills:
 Memory (in the Working Memory game children tap a sequence of squares in the same order they saw them light up)
 Attention (in the Attention and Focus game children search through a screen filled with many shapes to find all the ones that look

 Concentration (in the Inhibitory Control and Flexible Thinking game children use the shape of objects presented on screen to decide whether or not to tap an object as soon as they see it)

These are all factors that underpin learning, and are building blocks for a wide range of skills such as: forward planning and the ability to set and achieve positive goals, the ability to manage our behaviour and emotions and to consider consequences before engaging in action. They are fundamental to making responsible decisions, getting along with others, and coping with difficult circumstances.

Rumble's Quest takes students approximately 45 minutes to complete. It will be undertaken in class groups this term. The information we gather will help our school set directions for student support, and to inform teaching and learning strategies. We can use the game again in following years to gather information about the effectiveness of our student wellbeing strategies.
