

# WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is a 40 day season of preparation before Easter. It is a time where we are asked to reflect on our lives and on our relationship with God and others. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and finishes during Easter week. The forty days are symbolic of the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert.



Why we eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednes<u>day?</u>

Traditionally, Christians gave up meat, fat, eggs and dairy products for Lent. Shrove Tuesday was the last chance to use up some of these foods before Lent begins.

Why we receive ashes on Ash Wednesday?

The ashes that are placed on our forehead are a symbol of our mortality and a sign of sorrow and repentance. The ashes come from burning the palms from Palm Sunday of the previous year.

What can we "give up" or "sacrifice" during Lent?

It may be doing without something we enjoy, like chocolate or sugar. It may also include trying harder to help others. Many children give up things like lollies, ice-cream, TV or the computer. Often, this is hard for young children to do for the whole of Lent so they could try to give something up for a week at a time.




We have made a few changes this year.

- "active uniform" all students are allowed to wear their sports uniform each day
- students can wear the formal uniform in 2023
- Newsletter regularity will depend on the communication survey responses (see link on page 6)
- Children will be sent to 'RETHINK' for behaviour violations and parents contacted with the Rethink form sent home
- School assemblies will be twice a term only
- Children's birthdays will be called over the PA on their actual birthday. Only children present at school will receive small gifts (except for illness). Weekend birthdays will be announced the following Monday.
- Awards will be given for SAFE, LEARN and RESPECT
- Children with a 95% attendance record will be rewarded at the end of each term.

Last week we had the pleasure of commissioning our new student leaders for 2023. Congratulations to all our leaders, I know that you will all continue to display our school values and expectations. I was truly inspired by the high quality speeches they prepared and delivered.
















## Communication Survey

Congratulations to Year Six student, Mitch Irwin, on winning 2 gold medals at the Sydney Judo International Open.




## **ASSEMBLY NEXT WEEK**

#### Grade 6 Excursion








## **Project Compassion**
